- Prohibit insurance companies from discriminating based on a person’s pre-existing condition.

- Prohibit lifetime and annual limits under health policies and plans.
- Require coverage of and prohibit cost sharing for preventive services under health insurance policies and plans.
- Require health insurance policies to cover essential health benefits specified by DHS with limits on cost sharing.
- Require health plans to permit enrollment regardless of health status or gender.
