Election watchdog group says Supreme Court Justice-elect failed to file occupation information as required by law on 159 contributors.

MADISON - The campaign committee of Wisconsin Supreme Court Justice-elect Brian Hagedorn failed to file occupational information required by law for 159 individual contributions totaling \$70,106, according to a complaint filed Monday by the Wisconsin Democracy Campaign.

State law requires legislative and statewide candidates to identify the occupations of individuals who contribute more than \$200 in a calendar year to their campaigns.

The contributions allegedly lacking the information were in Hagedorn's latest campaign finance report, which covers fundraising and spending from Feb. 5 through March 18.

The Department of Justice (DOJ) filed a complaint with the Federal Election Commission (FEC) on April 16, 2019, alleging that the Wisconsin Democracy Campaign (WDC) violated the Federal Election Campaign Act (FECA) by failing to disclose the source of funds for its campaign activities. The complaint states that the WDC received a total of \$16,479,615 in contributions from 2017 to 2018, of which \$1,000,000 was from a single source, the Wisconsin State Bar Association. The DOJ is seeking civil penalties of up to \$10,000 per violation and an injunction against future violations.
