Residents will not be allowed to conduct business in person at City Hall after March 17, 2020 at 4:30 pm due to the COVID-19 crisis. Please access services either by phone or via the internet.

Green Bay, WI - Mayor Eric Genrich makes the safety of all community members his paramount concern. In his efforts to protect the public, he will close City Hall, 100 North Jefferson, Green Bay, WI, to in-person visits from public, beginning March 17, 2020 at 4:30 pm.
