- Wisconsin grows 95% of the United States ginseng and sells 85% of their produce to China. These farmers saw their businesses plummet because of the trade war.

Farmers got virtually nothing for what the trade war has cost them.

- After promising roughly \$50 billion in purchases from China in Phase One, the USDA predicted China would only purchase \$14 billion in agriculture products.
- Trump's farm-aid packages have done little to make up for what small and medium-size family farms have lost as a result of Trump's trade war with China.
 - In the lastest farm bailout, the top 10% received 2/3s of the bailout money.
- The top half of recipients received <u>95% of the \$28 billion</u> that was administered through the Market Facilitation Program.
- Trump pushed for a grand photo of the signing of Phase One at the same time he was ignoring the warnings of COVID-19 from his intelligence community.

Manufacturers have also felt the burden of Trump's trade war and his kowtowing to the Chinese government in the early months of the pandemic.

- In July, Harley Davidson announced they were <u>laying off 700 workers</u>. Trump previously called for a boycott of the Milwaukee based motorcycle manufacturing company.
- Briggs & Stratton, a small engine manufacturer, <u>filed</u> for bankruptcy and plans to sell its assets.
- Verso Papers announced it was <u>firing 900 of its employees</u> from the Wisconsin Rapids plant because of the COVID-19 pandemic.
