LA CROSSE, WI – Less than a month after trying to put an end to **Donald Trump's** presidential campaign, several top Senate Republicans are now eagerly embracing his candidacy and singing his praises. The awkward change of position brought about by Donald Trump's status as the presumptive Republican Presidential nominee caught many by surprise given the overwhelming opposition to his candidacy.
