The college fair is a collaborative effort between Taylor's Senate office and many other community/public service organizations throughout the State of Wisconsin. "We have been overwhelmed by the number of schools that have confirmed their participation.

I encourage all students and their parents to come out and take advantage of all the information and tools that will assist them in better understanding their higher education options" Taylor said. There are many resources to utilize, including panel discussions on the HBCU experience and sessions on Financial Aid 101, NCAA Clearinghouse rules, Essay Boot Camp.
