

Johnson Stood Against New Bipartisan Law To End Surprise Medical Bills

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MADISON, Wis. – On Saturday, a [new law that puts an end to surprise medical billing](#) went into effect, despite Senator Johnson's [efforts to stop the bipartisan effort](#)
