WASHINGTON - Ignoring the loss of over 74,000 Wisconsin jobs due to past free trade agreements, Senator Ron Johnson voted today to allow Congress to "fast-track" the job-killing Trans-Pacific Partnership.

The agreement would allow corporate interests to repeat history and ship American jobs overseas devastating even more American workers and middle class families.
