Legislative Session

Representative Lisa Subeck gave the Democratic Weekly Radio address, emphasizing Democrats commitment to making college affordable and contrasting our beliefs to the Republicans' inability to pass meaningful college affordability legislation. This session the Republicans prioritized legislation to ensure their reelection and left over one million Wisconsinites paying unreasonably high interest rates on their student debt because the Republicans refuse to let people renegotiate their student loans the way you can with a mortgage. While Republicans are wishing the issue of college debt would solve itself, Democrats put forward a comprehensive plan called Higher Ed, Lower Debt bill that takes the issue head on. We need our legislators looking for solutions to help Wisconsinites get ahead.

This is why it is so important that we start spreading our great Democratic message about college affordability, better wages, equal pay for equal work, increased workers rights, better environmental protections, strengthening social security and being more inclusive right now
