

MADISON – Today, Senate Democratic Leader Melissa Agard's (D-Madison) bipartisan *Child Victims' Act*

received a public hearing in the Senate Committee on Mental Health, Substance Abuse Prevention, Children and Families.

Currently, civil charges regarding the sexual assault of a child must be brought forward before the alleged victim turns 35 years old. For criminal charges, either no statute of limitations exists or charges must be brought forth before the victim turns 45 years old. Senate Bill 302 extends the statute of limitations to file a civil action in court against a perpetrator of child sexual abuse to 45 years old.

Senator Agard released the following statement:
