Election watchdog group says Supreme Court Justice-elect failed to file occupation information as required by law on 159 contributors.

MADISON - The campaign committee of Wisconsin Supreme Court Justice-elect Brian Hagedorn failed to file occupational information required by law for 159 individual contributions totaling \$70,106, according to a complaint filed Monday by the Wisconsin Democracy Campaign.

State law requires legislative and statewide candidates to identify the occupations of individuals who contribute more than \$200 in a calendar year to their campaigns.

The contributions allegedly lacking the information were in Hagedorn's latest campaign finance report, which covers fundraising and spending from Feb. 5 through March 18.

The Department of Justice, which has a long history of protecting the rights of citizens, has filed a complaint with the Federal Election Commission (FEC) against the Hagedorn campaign committee. The complaint alleges that the committee violated the Federal Election Campaign Act (FECA) by failing to disclose certain contributions. The FEC is the independent agency responsible for enforcing the laws that govern federal elections. The Hagedorn campaign committee has been notified of the complaint and is required to respond to the FEC's findings. The Wisconsin Democracy Campaign is pleased to see the Department of Justice taking action to ensure the integrity of the electoral process.
