West Point - Governor Evers announced the official application and selection process for The People's Maps Commission Thursday, the nonpartisan redistricting commission to draw fair, impartial maps following the 2020 U.S. Census.

Additionally, nonpartisan redistricting is widely supported, with 51 of Wisconsin's 72 counties, representing approximately 78% of Wisconsinites, having passed resolutions or referenda supporting nonpartisan redistricting in our state.
