

Bipartisan Infrastructure Law Turns One, \$2.7B allocated to Wisconsin to improve state infrastructure.

WASHINGTON - Tuesday marked the one year anniversary of President Biden doing what Trump and his Republican Congress promised for years but couldn't accomplish – signing a Bipartisan Infrastructure Law that is making once-in-a-generation investments in our nation's roads, bridges, railroads, ports, airports, water systems, and high-speed internet. While Trump and his Republican Congress promised an infrastructure week that never materialized, President Biden and Democrats are delivering an infrastructure decade.
